What makes a credential eligible?

- Industry-recognized
- Tech-focused
- Short-term

Award Amounts:

- Up to \$2,000 per credential
- \$30,000 per employer, EACH funding round






After 12 Application Periods:

- Over 1,700 unique Ohio employers awarded for a total of over \$35 million.
- Over 36,000 credentials awarded.
- Next Application Period: May 2nd through 31st at 3:00PM

Individual Microcredential Assistance Program (IMAP)

Sister Program to TechCred

- Same Credential List
- Training providers are applicants



Industry Sector Partnership Grant

- Grants fund collaboration between businesses, education and training providers, and other community leaders who are invested in improving their region's workforce
- Both **existing** and **emerging** partnerships
- Regional and/or industry-specific focus

Innovative Workforce Incentive Program (IWIP)

Implementation Grant Designed to help schools start up programs so that students can begin to earn qualifying credentials. Incentive Payment "Bonus" payments to schools when students earn a credential on the IWIP credential list.
